Re: City of Courtenay Quarterly Report

April 1, 2022 to June 26, 2022

The Comox Valley Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) will be providing quarterly updates on policing in the community. This will include information on Calls for Service (CFS), Traffic files, Break and Enter files, Theft from Vehicle files, Drug Trafficking files, Violence in Relationship files, and Sexual Assault files. Quarterly reports will coincide with the Comox Valley RCMP Annual Performance reporting time lines in conjunction with Community Priorities.

First Quarter: April 1st to June 30th
Second Quarter: July 1st to September 30th
Third Quarter: October 1st to December 31st
Fourth Quarter: January 1st to March 31st

This is a provisional report for the first quarter of the 2022 fiscal year, summarizing data between April 1, 2022 and June 26, 2022, because the Comox Valley RCMP Crime Analyst will be away on leave in July when the complete data for June will be available.


