## <u>DAY OF AWARENESS FOR SURVIVORS</u> <u>OF FINANCIAL ABUSE AND ECONOMIC INJUSTICE</u>

WHEREAS Economic abuse is a deliberate pattern of control in which

individuals interfere with their partner's ability to acquire, use,

and maintain economic resources; and

WHEREAS A lack of access to economic resources undermines a woman's

independence and agency, such as limiting her access to social support services, undermining mental well-being and exacerbating other risk factors contributing to poverty and other

forms of marginalization affecting women; and

WHEREAS Each day in Canada, approximately 51% of women staying in

shelters for women and children report experiencing financial abuse, economic abuse is a seldom-talked about yet prevalent issue faced by survivors of domestic violence in Canada; and

WHEREAS Economic abuse has happened to many generations of

Canadian women and continues to happen regardless of socio-

economic status, race, age or other identity factors; and

WHEREAS It is of utmost importance that government, at all levels, act to

protect victims and support survivors of economic abuse;
