

Proclamation

2024 Day of Remembrance and Action for Islamophobia Day

WHEREAS On January 29, 2017, a white gunman entered the

Islamic Cultural Centre mosque in Quebec City and opened

fire on dozens of Muslim worshipers;

AND WHEREAS By the time the shooting had ended, six people had been

tragically killed and 19 more were injured: Ibrahima Barry, Mamadou Tanou Barry, Khaled Belkacemi, Aboubaker Thabti, Abdelkrim Hassane, and Azzedine Soufiane lost

their lives that night;

AND WHEREAS Many municipalities across Canada commemorate the

events of January 29 with their Muslim community partners, and there is a nation-wide campaign for the

federal government to recognize the day nationally;

NOW THEREFORE I, Bob Wells, Mayor of the City of Courtenay, hereby

proclaim January 29th, 2024 as "Day of Remembrance and

Action on Islamophobia" in Courtenay, BC.
