**Elections BC** is responsible for advertising rules, campaign financing and disclosure rules, and registration of elector organizations.

Visit the Ministry of Municipal Affairs for general information about election administration, legislation, and processes. Relevant election legislation includes Part 3 of the Local Government Act, the Local Elections Campaign Financing Act, the Local Government Elections Regulation, and the School Act.

City of Courtenay Election Bylaw No. 3073 establishes procedures for the 2022 Local Government Election, which includes the use of Automated Voting Machines and regulations for election signs.

Council appoints a Chief Election
Officer to ensure the process is run in accordance with the Local
Government Act.

### Who Can Vote?

To vote in the City of Courtenay election, you must meet the following qualifications:

#### Resident Electors

- Be a Canadian citizen.
- Be 18 years of age or older on the day of registration or 18 years of age or older on general voting day.
- Be a resident of the City of Courtenay on the day of registration.
- Have been a resident of British Columbia for at least six months before the day of registration.
- Not be disqualified from voting in an election.
- There is no corporate or business vote in local elections.

### Non-Resident Property Elector

- Be a Canadian citizen
- 18 years of age or older on general voting day for the election (October 15, 2022)
- A registered owner of real property in the City of Courtenay for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration.
- A resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration.
- Not be entitled to register as a resident elector.
- If a property is owned by more than one individual only one owner may vote.
- A person cannot vote on behalf of a corporation based on a property owned wholly or in part by a corporation.

- Not disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law; and
- If there is more than one registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of owners, register as a non-resident property elector.

# **Acceptable Identification**

New registrations require two pieces of ID that provide evidence of identity and place of residence, at least one with a signature (s. 72 LGA). The following forms of ID are accepted:

- Driver's Licence
- BC Identification Card (issued by ICBC)
- Photo BC Services Card (Care Card)
- Non-photo BC Services Card (Care Card)
- Certificate of Indian Status (issued by Government of Canada)
- Car insurance papers
- Provincial Social Assistance FORM SDES8
- Statement of Employment Insurance benefits
- BC Government cheque
- Canadian Forces identification
- Firearms Licence (issued by Government
- of Canada)
- Social Insurance Number Card
- Citizenship Card
- Property Tax Notice
- Credit card or debit card or statement
- Utility bill such as coaxial cable services, electricity, gas, telephone services, water
- Valid current passport
- Birth certificate


