Your input will be used to develop street design options that will be considered by Council and the public.




What is a Complete Street?

Complete Streets are streets designed for all ages, abilities, and modes of travel. This approach considers all street users - pedestrians, cyclists, transit users, commercial vehicles and motorists - in the design of a safe and comfortable street. It also considers the surrounding context and land use.

Each Complete Street is unique with design based on community priorities and interests.

Designing and building Complete Streets contributes to strong, livable and vibrant communities.



Gateway to downtown




Gas Tax Grant Funding

The City of Courtenay has received **\$3.25 million** from the federal Gas Tax Fund, Strategic Priorities category.

PROJECT GOALS

Once re-designed and built, the 5th Street Complete Streets project will:

-  Create a street that is safer and more comfortable to bike and walk on;
-  Encourage residents to walk and bike, instead of driving, thus shifting transportation mode share;
-  Encourage more children to walk and bike to nearby Puntledge Park School;
-  Connect to Fitzgerald Ave, an important north-south cycling connection;
-  Manage storm water on-site; and,
-  Support local economic development opportunities in downtown Courtenay.


