NORM CARRUTHERS	 City is aware that we'll need a concise 'guidebook' to make the OCP accessible to a variety of audiences. The Advisory Committee will have to decide what their final report to Council will look like, how composed. If there are divergent views on policy, is valuable to identify in the report. Norm Carruthers discussed the following items: Had a strong reaction to the word 'decolonizing'. Realized that this will require dialog as people will not understand the same way.
BETTY DONALDSON	Betty Donaldson discussed the following items: Reminder there is a public lag time. We'll be adopting the plan when people will be coming aware of it.
DON FERGUSON	 Getting consensus on the big picture of the plan will be important. Don Ferguson discussed the following items: Reminder of the Courtenay Cultural Services Report. It provides a roadmap to the Culture, Heritage and Arts chapter of the OCP.
ERIN NOWAK	 Erin Nowak discussed the following items: Natural system function really important to highlight. Glad to see natural assets included in the utility section – important step. Reminder of a number of resources/documents to consider: Cumberland's policies re: parks, private lands; Nature without Borders report; Saanich Biodiversity Framework; Provincial Conservation Data Centre with staff resources (e.g. the local Municipal Natural Asset Initiative - Species At Risk Act project). Please include conservation sector to the parks and infrastructure consultations.
SHEENA CAMPBELL	 Sheena Campbell discussed the following items: Noticed Food Policy Council is missing. An important topic and player in local economic development (food sales, access, distribution).
TOM DISHLEVOY	 Tom Dishlevoy discussed the following items: Want to see a stronger stance on floodplain retreat, more on rainwater harvesting infrastructure, need a section on development certainty. Lot sizes in land use section play a formative role in many of the goals of the plan. Need to spend more time considering that factor. Dates in the document need to be better aligned (e.g. many target dates listed) and need commitment to interim targets. Don't forget, most people don't start acting until the deadline. Planning for growth of parks system needed, similarly to other municipal infrastructure.
ANNELIES HENCKEL	Annelies Henckel discussed the following items: Agree that growth of parks and interim targets are needed – are corresponding goals, advocacy points, of the Comox Youth Climate Council.
NORM CARRUTHERS	Norm Carruthers discussed the following items: > Will take lead with Betty in scoping out the report to Council and will bring concept to Advisory Committee for discussion at the next meeting.
