GENERAL VOTING DAY

General voting day will be open to qualified electors of the City of Courtenay on **Saturday, October 20, 2018 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the following locations:**

- Conference Hall of the Florence Filberg Centre, 411 Anderton Avenue, Courtenay, B.C.
- Queneesh Elementary School, 2345 Mission Road, Courtenay, B.C.

ELECTOR REGISTRATION

If you are not on the List of Electors, you may register at the time of voting by completing the required application form available at the voting place. To be qualified as a Resident Elector a person must:

- be 18 years of age or older on October 20, 2018;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- have resided in British Columbia for at least six months immediately preceding the day of registration;
- have resided in the City of Courtenay for at least 30 days immediately preceding the day of registration;
- not be disqualified by the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or be otherwise disqualified by law.

Note: To register at the time of voting, a person must provide at least two documents that provide evidence of the applicant's identity and place of residence pursuant to Local Government Elections Regulation 380/93. Examples of acceptable documents include a BC Driver's Licence, ICBC Owner Certificate of Insurance, BC CareCard, Property Tax Notice, and Utility Bill.

To be qualified as a **Non-Resident Property Elector** a person must:

- not be entitled to register as a resident elector;
- be 18 years of age or older on October 20, 2018;
- be a Canadian Citizen;
- have resided in British Columbia for at least six months immediately preceding the day of registration;
- have been a registered owner of real property in the City of Courtenay for at least 30 days immediately before day of elector registration;
- be a registered owner of the real property, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, and be an individual who is not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust;
- not be disqualified by the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or be otherwise disqualified by law.

If there is more than one individual who is the registered owner of real property, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, only one of those individuals may register as a non-resident property elector under this section in relation to the real property.

If there is more than one individual who is the registered owner of the real property, the person registering must have written consent of the number of those individuals who, together with the person registering, are a majority of those individuals.
