

City of Courtenay Lake Trail Multi-Use Path

Construction set to start mid-September

Sept. 10, 2025

Construction work on the new Lake Trail Multi-Use Path is set to get underway, beginning next week (Sept. 15).

Construction is expected to take about two months and be complete in November. Sakaw Projects is the contractor completing the work.

The project will connect Lake Trail and Arden schools with a safe corridor for the many pedestrians and cyclists who move through the corridor each day.

The work to begin this month is Phase 1 of the project, and

includes a gravel pathway from Lake Trail school to Webdon Road and the addition of bike lanes to Webb Road (at Arden Elementary). Phase 2 of the project – the extension of the gravel pathway, is dependent on environmental permitting.

What to expect during construction:

- Single lane alternating traffic will be required during portions of the work. People moving through the area should expect delays.
- Work will begin at Lake Trail school-end of the project and move toward Arden.
- Construction will be focused during weekday, workday hours. Weekend work could occur if necessary, but is not scheduled at this time.
